

SFIS STUDENT COMMUNICABLE ILLNESS GUIDANCE TREE

ALL STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO FOLLOW THE SFIS GUIDANCE TREE

Notify the Academic Office if....

Can the student come to campus?

When can the student return to campus?

What documentation must the student submit in order to return to campus?

Your Student...

is ordered to quarantine by your tribe.

No, vaccinated and unvaccinated students must quarantine at home.

Students can return after they are cleared by the tribe.

Parent must provide tribal clearance to attendance counselor and/or dorms.

Your Student...

tests positive for COVID-19.

No, vaccinated and unvaccinated students must isolate at home. [§]

Symptomatic students can return 5 days after symptoms began AND they are fever-free for 24 hours without medication AND other symptoms have improved.

Asymptomatic students can return 5 days after the positive test result.*

Parent must submit documentation that the student meets the criteria for returning to campus to the attendance counselor and/or dorms.

*If symptoms develop after testing positive, your 5 day isolation period starts over, and the above (symptomatic) guidance applies.

Your Student...

is sick.

To include the following symptoms:

Cough, Fever, Chills, Nausea/Vomiting, headache, body aches, runny nose, etc...

No, vaccinated and unvaccinated students must stay at home.

Students can return after they test negative for COVID-19 AND are no longer sick.

Students can return after a healthcare provider documents a reason for the symptoms other than COVID-19, and have been cleared to return to school.

Students can return after 5 days from the start of the symptoms AND they have been fever-free for 24 hours without medication AND symptoms have improved.

Parent must submit test results to the attendance counselor and/or dorms.

Parent must submit doctor's note to the attendance counselor and/or dorms.

Parent must submit documentation that the student meets the criteria for returning to campus to the attendance counselor and/or dorms.



[§] Does not apply to students who have tested positive within the last 60 days, have completed the 5 day isolation, and are asymptomatic.
